Impression #3 — It's hard to imagine the two major parties offering more disappointing candidates than Trump and Clinton. The absolute clownishness and unsuitability of the Republican nominee and the fractured credibility of his Democratic rival have shown us how inept the process of candidate selection really was this time around. Let's not only talk of the Grand Old Party and how it failed us. The Democrats should have seen the Clinton fallout coming from a long way off.

Impression #4 — An enormous increase of goodwill and civility followed in the campaign, and the previous comradery of time, will be essential if the country is to make a new beginning after Nov. 8.

And that is no option. We absolutely need new beginnings. Given the scar tissue the election is leaving in its wake, the "war" between Trump and Clinton and, across the board, between Republicans and Democrats, has been as devastating to the country as anything we've witnessed since the Nixon years. The terrorist attacks of 9/11, and terrorist-related suffering that followed largely united the American people and hardened our resolve. We fought evil as one, undivided, and hopeful nation.

At the moment, we are a people hurting and divided. We are struggling to hope. Whoever wins in the coming 48 hours, and it will probably be Hillary Clinton, will hag a trophy cracked and badly tarnished. This campaign has been a messy, muddy, down on all fours wrestling match. Not only has it exhausted and nearly demoralized the electorate. It has come very close to sullying the office of the American presidency.

Impression #5 — We need reconciliation between the two sides badly, and it is not clear how that can come about. Only a handful of gargantuan proportions, I believe, can invail-

date the previous sentence: The results of the electoral vote may be clear, and that will help, but a popular vote of 45 percent or so far from being a ticket will make national reconciliation all the harder. No one expects a popular landslide for either candidate to happen.

We have no time to waste. Confronting problems in health-care, the economy, racial and religious tensions, and crises in a slew of humanitarian and international hot spots requires time that the new president will not easily find.

Impression #6 — The adjective may alternate some, but as a nation we are in genuine need of spiritual healing after Nov. 8. Healing can come beyond the limits of organized faith and religion, and other deeds. We need

not identify ourselves as Muslim, Jewish, Christian or anything else to avail ourselves of the potential to be healed from within our frail humanity. Belief in a higher power, shining light in a time of darkness may encourage many of us. It does so. Let others seek solace elsewhere.

For healing to come, we must admit we are broken, and need help. I still believe things will pan out all right after Nov. 8. Battles do end, and soldiers do lay down their arms.

This is the time for all Americans to do just that.

Ukrainian hack attack embarrassing Moscow

In October, hackers based in Ukraine hacked into the computer systems of the Russian government. The information released appears to be genuine. The Atlantic Council, a respected Washington policy institute, won't say for this. The New York Times has checked with several correspondents in Ukraine, who testify the documents are authentic. The documents concern Russia's direct involvement in the domestic affairs of Ukraine in the 2014 ouster of President Viktor Yanukovich, a Putin ally who fled to Russia. Putin himself, and has interest in eastern Ukraine with forces described as "volunteers."

Russia's Black Sea fleet is headquartered in Crimea, where support for Russia is relatively strong. The EU and the Obama administration aggressively protested Russian aggression and imposed sanctions, no little gesture given the structural weakness of Russia's economy.

The violence within Ukraine reflects a wider tug-of-war for influence and influence between the EU and Russia. This competition also encourages NATO involvement, at least indirectly. Also in 2014, Ukraine reached an agreement with the EU.

For the U.S., EU and NATO, effective policy must be put in broad historical context. George Soros, probably the best perspective American analyst of Russia, wrote in 1994 that Soviet leaders "are not like ... us." War to the death with Nazi Germany has had a profound continuing impact on the nation, including the current generation. Totalitarianism fed

traditional anxieties regarding territory and national security. Contemporary ideologues adds to ethnic tensions. Putin has successfully contained various separatist movements in Russia, notably in Chechnya, Chechen President Ramzan Kadyrov was previously a powerful separatist leader, but is now allied with Moscow. Vladimir Surkov is of Chechen descent. The turbo-talking officials of the George W. Bush administration pressed eastern expansion of NATO, including membership by both Georgia and Ukraine. Not surprisingly, Russia became alarmed. During this time, Georgia launched a military attack on breakaway South Ossetia, which was the Russian border in 2008 invaded. President Nicolas Sarkozy of France berated the Russian side. The Bush administration did nothing.

Ethnic instability is endemic to the region. During World War II, Soviet dictator Josef Stalin and his allies deported the stable population of Moskvkhan Turks from Georgia as part of a vast relocation of an estimated 1.5 million people to Central Asia and Siberia.

Ukraine likewise is historically entangled with Russia. The beginning of the Russian revolution in 1917 sparked an independence movement. After years of struggle, Ukraine was absorbed into the new Soviet Union and suffered Stalinist repression, useful as to the national interest of both nations. Indirectly, in the U.S., such an effort could encourage renewed emphasis on human intelligence, which is relatively weak in the U.S. and the UK. Founded by the U.S. and the UK, UKUSA was transformed into the British Commonwealth members Canada, Australia and New Zealand over the following years. Thus, the foundation for a giant intelligence network which monitors the communication traffic in all continents from five different points and shares this information with the allied countries was laid.

This alliance between five Anglo-sphere countries is based upon the principles of sharing every kind of intelligence (primarily the signals intelligence) between the countries, each other and a vow to never spy on member countries. "Worse than the US"

Snowden states that this spy network is not the sole work of the U.S., but in fact the main player is the UK, and in order to emphasize the fact that English intelligence services has no limits, he says "THEY (THE UK) ARE WORSE THAN THE USA."

Prism and XKeyscore, which surfaced by Tempora, are also among the high-tech intelligence gathering, analysis and filtering programs that Five Eyes uses. These can connect to computer servers and satellites in the military and diplomatic facilities of many foreign countries. Another Five Eyes product, HACHLON, is frequently mentioned in espionage techno-thrillers, in the oldest and most basic version of these programs.

We should also state that New Zealand's electronic monitoring agency, GCSB, is also hard at work. It gathers the communication information from the Asia-Pacific region via the NSA's controversial XKeyscore program and delivers it to its bosses in the UK and U.S. in the form of metadata packages. According to the Snowden documents, the information gathered by GCSB has no relation to security threats. On the contrary, GCSB directed its spying activities to a wide range of countries, including that of New Zealand's friends, leading partners and closest Pacific neighbors.

Even if we only consider the information provided in this article, it is obvious that the contrary to popular fallacy, the U.S. is only one of the Five Eyes, while the

brain governing all these "eyes" resides in Great Britain, as it has been for centuries. Based on the environment, conditions and the plans, sometimes this brain comes to the forefront, and sometimes it hides in the background.

It's for Your Own Good

The activities of Five Eyes continue on unrestrained, disregarding laws, personal lives and privacy. This dark organization carries out its illegal and illicit operations by hiding behind clerical screens such as "terror threat" and "security issue," just like it does with its every kind of imperialistic activity.

It is obvious that the real purpose of this organization, as it has always been, is to gain the most powerful political, military and economic dominance over the world and create the most advanced master of exploitation based on self-interest.

These kinds of sinister organizations draw their strength from their secrecy.

For this reason, the best way to fight against organizations like Five Eyes is to expose them and bring them out from the darkness. They hide in the light, to make them transparent. In order to win this fight, the good must be allied together and support each other.

The name Five Eyes, which is used to describe an organization comprised of five countries, requires a brain that rules over those five eyes, evaluates the received information and makes it "saw" and the place to look for this brain is the island of Britain.

Il y a cinq yeux interconnectés et disséminés à travers le monde qui observent chaque instant de votre vie personnelle.

"Five Eyes" (Cinq Yeux) est le nom d'un réseau de renseignement commun composé de cinq pays que sont le Royaume-Uni, les Etats-Unis, le Canada, l'Australie et la Nouvelle-Zélande. L'origine de ce réseau remonte à l'UKUSA, un accord sur le partage des renseignements signé entre le Royaume-Uni et les Etats-Unis en mars 1946. Fondé par les Etats-Unis et le Royaume-Uni, l'UKUSA fut changé en l'alliance "Five Eyes" en incluant les membres du Commonwealth Britannique qui sont le Canada, l'Australie et la Nouvelle-Zélande à travers les années qui suivirent. Donc la fondation d'un grand réseau de renseignement qui surveille le trafic de communication dans tous les continents à partir de cinq points différents et qui partage ces informations avec les pays alliés était posée.

L'alliance entre ces cinq pays anglophones est basée sur les principes d'échange de toute sorte d'informations entre eux (principalement les informations de type ROEM

ou renseignement d'origine électromagnétique) et de ne jamais espionner les pays membres de cette alliance. Cette alliance vieille de 70 ans contrôle, analyse et rassemble les communications mondiales avec son infrastructure de contrôle mondial incorporé.

Les services secrets principaux de ces cinq pays constituent la partie essentielle de ce système de contrôle : la "NSA" des Etats-Unis, le "GCHQ" en Grande-Bretagne, le "CSEC" au Canada, le "ASD" en Australie et le "GCSB" en Nouvelle-Zélande étant les plus importants. En plus de ça, de nombreux autres services secrets subsidiaires sont les sources les plus importantes du réseau "Five Eyes". Parmi ceux-là, par exemple, il y a le RAF (Royal Air Force) du Royaume-Uni connu pour être le plus grand centre de contrôle électronique du monde.

Là-bas, des informations sont rassemblées pour les Etats-Unis et le Royaume-Uni grâce au contrôle du réseau de communication du monde entier. Même en considérant que seul la NSA et le RAF font partie de ce système, la force et l'ampleur des capacités du "Five Eyes" pour ce qui est de collecter de l'information peuvent être bien comprises.

Comme on le sait, les documents révélant les relations secrètes entre les pays membre du Five Eyes et les opérations d'informations mondiales qu'ils ont menées ont été dévoilés en 2013 par Edward Snowden, l'ex-employé de la CIA et de la NSA. Ces documents, qui ont été publiés dans les journaux The Guardian, The Washington Post, Der Spiegel et The New York Times, mettent à nu les détails de ce contrôle illégal et des opérations de collecte d'informations.

Des tentacules d'une longue portée

Selon ces documents, parmi les instances écoutées et surveillées par les services de renseignements britanniques en liaison avec la NSA se trouvaient des diplomates du sommet du G20, les présidents des pays tels que l'Allemagne, le Brésil ou le Mexique, des politiciens, les bureaux de l'ONU, diverses ambassades ainsi que des organismes de presse. La mise sur écoute du bureau de Kofi Annan pendant le début de la guerre d'Irak peut être considérée comme une des nombreuses activités des services secrets anglais.

Il y a des antennes satellites, des stations d'écoute et de surveillance appartenant à la NSA et au GCHQ britannique dans les ambassades, dans les bases militaires et dans les agences à travers le monde entier.

Ils ont un accès immédiat aux caméras de sécurité de presque tous les pays. Les bateaux britanniques et américains qui sont sur les côtes chinoises écoutent les communications radios de la région.

Les antennes satellites placées à Fort Meade, à Maryland, surveillent les transactions bancaires à travers le monde entier.

Selon les nouvelles rapportées par le The Guardian, afin de rassembler des informations sur la communication mondiale, le Royaume-Uni a acquis toute sorte d'informations personnelles en ayant eu secrètement accès aux 200 câbles à fibre optique intercontinentaux qui transportent les communications téléphoniques, les messages ainsi que le trafic internet. Le service de renseignement britannique, le GCHQ, peut recueillir simultanément des informations de 46 de ces câbles.

Ce programme secret, dont le nom de code est "Tempora", avait été utilisé pendant 18 mois quand les nouvelles avaient fait surface. Et le nombre de données (enregistrement téléphonique, SMS, e-mails, l'historique internet, des informations

sur les comptes de divers sites web comme Facebook...) rassemblées seulement pendant cette période a atteint des proportions gigantesques.

Par exemple, approximativement 600 millions de conversations téléphoniques étaient enregistrés en une seule journée. La quantité d'information rassemblée quotidiennement était équivalente à la capacité d'information existant dans 192 bibliothèques nationales anglaise.

"Pire que les Etats-Unis"

Snowden explique que ce réseau d'espion n'est pas le seul travail des Etats-Unis mais qu'en fait l'acteur principal est le Royaume-Uni et pour mettre en relief le fait que le service de renseignement anglais n'a aucune limite, il dit : "Ils (le Royaume-Uni) sont pire que les Etats-Unis."

Prism et XKeyscore, qui ont fait surface tout comme Tempora, sont aussi des programmes de pointe de collecte d'informations, d'analyse et de filtrage que Five Eyes utilise. Ils peuvent se connecter sur les serveurs informatiques et sur les satellites de l'armée et des installations diplomatiques de beaucoup de pays étrangers. Un autre produit Five Eyes, ECHELON, qui est fréquemment cité dans des films d'espionnage, est le plus vieux et le plus basique de ces programmes.

Précisons aussi que l'agence de surveillance électronique de la Nouvelle-Zélande, le GCSB, travaille tout aussi durement. Cette agence rassemble des informations de communication circulant dans la région de l'Asie-Pacifique via le programme controversé XKeyscore de la NSA et livre ces informations à ses chefs au Royaume-Uni et aux Etats-Unis sous forme d'empaquetage des métadonnées. Selon les documents de Snowden, les informations rassemblées par le GCSB n'ont aucune relation avec les menaces pour la sécurité. Au contraire, le GCSB dirigeait ses activités d'espionnages sur une vaste gamme de pays parmi lesquels figurent les amis de la Nouvelle-Zélande, les partenaires commerciaux et les plus proches voisins du Pacifique.

Même si l'on ne considère que les informations fournies dans cet article, il est évident que, contrairement à la croyance populaire, les Etats-Unis ne sont qu'un seul œil parmi cinq autres tandis que le cerveau gouvernant ces cinq "yeux" réside en Grande-Bretagne comme ça l'a été pendant des siècles. En fonction de l'environnement, des conditions et des plans, ce cerveau se met parfois au premier rang et parfois en arrière-plan.

C'est pour votre bien

Les activités de Five Eyes continuent de façon effrénée sans tenir compte des lois, de la vie privée et de l'intimité. Cette sombre organisation effectue ses opérations illégales et illicites en se cachant derrière des excuses rebattues comme "la menace terroriste" et "les questions de sécurité" comme elle le fait avec chacune de ses activités impérialistes.

Il est évident que le véritable but de cette organisation, comme ça l'a toujours été, est d'obtenir la plus puissante dominance politique, militaire et économique à travers le monde et de créer la méthode d'exploitation la plus sophistiquée basée sur l'intérêt personnel.

Ces sortes d'organisations sinistres tirent leur force de leur discrétion. Pour cette raison, la meilleure façon de se battre contre des organisations comme Five Eyes est de les mettre à nu et de les tirer de l'obscurité vers la lumière pour les rendre plus


visibles. Pour pouvoir remporter ce combat, les bonnes personnes doivent s'allier entre eux et se soutenir les uns les autres.

Here, intelligence is gathered for U.S. and the UK by monitoring the communication networks of the whole world. Even if we consider that only the NSA and the RAF are a part of this system, the strength and the extent of the capacity of "Five Eyes" to gather intelligence can be better understood.

As it is known, the documents revealing the secret relationships between the Five Eyes countries and the global intelligence operations they carried out were exposed by the former CIA and NSA employee Edward Snowden in 2013. These documents, which were featured in The Guardian, The Washington Post, Der Spiegel and The New York Times, brought the details of the illegal monitoring and intelligence gathering operations of Five Eyes into the light.

Far-reaching Tentacles

According to the documents, among the bodies English intelligence service listened and monitored in liaison with the NSA were diplomats from the G-20 summit, the presidents of countries including Germany, Brazil and Mexico, politicians, U.N. offices, various embassies and media outlets. The bugging and the eavesdropping of Kofi Annan's office during the early stages of the Iraq War can be considered as one of the many activities of English secret service.

There are satellite dishes, listening and monitoring stations belonging to the NSA and English GCHQ in embassies, military bases and agencies all over the world.
